POLITICIANS VISITING SKYPARK

It's election time in Sonoma County, and the politicians are out in force.

Valerie Brown, the incumbent Supervisor representing the First District, visited

Sonoma Skypark recently and met with pilots and shareholders to reassure them that she supported Sonoma Skypark and would sign the petition saying just that.

This despite having referred to Sonoma Skypark as a "private club", saying that operations there devalued neighbors property and directing Sonoma County staff to contact the FAA and convince them that they should reclassify Sonoma Skypark from public use to some other classification that would then not be eligible for FAA and California State mandated airport protection.

Ms. Brown was able to convince two of the other four Sonoma County Supervisors to vote with her to direct Sonoma County Planning staff to find a reason to open Sonoma Skypark's use permit and either saddle the airport with additional restrictions or revoke the use permit entirely.

Supervisor Brown recently sent a letter to the Sonoma Skypark board members telling them again that she supports the airport and that if they proceed with the new airport office and flight school building plans that the use permit would be opened for review and additional restrictions would be placed on airport operations.

With that kind of support how can Skypark lose?

Ron Price received the following email from one of the candidates running against Valerie Brown. It is reprinted here for your information only and does not constitute an endorsement by Sonoma Skypark or EAA Chapter 1268.

There are only a few individuals who want to see the airport closed. They have successfully lobbied Valerie Brown to advocate their position that Sonoma Skypark operations should be severely curtailed or eliminated.

It is important that Supervisor Brown hear from the vast majority of local citizens who support the continued operation of Sonoma Skypark as a valuable part of the transportation resources for Sonoma County.
