OSHKOSH 2009

July 27 through August 2. Clear your calendar, we're going flying!

I am planning on leaving Sunday July 19 and attending the Pietenpol fly-in at Brodhead, WI from the 22nd through the 24th, then flying up to Oshkosh on Sunday July 25. Depending on weather, we may go up through Oregon, Washington and Idaho again, then across Montana into the mid-west. The highest pass on that route is a little over 4,000' so we won't need to do a lot of climbing just to miss the mountains.

This year is the 80th anniversary of the Pietenpol Air Camper so the Pietenpol pilots are planning a mass fly-in to Oshkosh and will display as a group.

Oshkosh has seen many improvements thanks to the hard work of the EAA staff and volunteers, including a new type club building to replace the tent next to the Vintage Red Barn. That and new restrooms and permanent showers should make a more comfortable stay for those camping on the field.

John Thomason has a hangar at Cottage Grove, OR and a house at Brodhead, so you can talk to him about finding space on the floor or renting a bed if you will be stopping at either airport along the way.

I'm hoping to finally make it to Priest Lake, though I'm not getting my hopes up too high until I'm on short final.

If you can get away for a week or two I guarantee that you might get more flying in that one trip than you do the rest of the year. The only disclaimer is that Oshkosh is very, very addictive.

Simply called "AIRPORT DAY", the airport staff and a small group of dedicated volunteers will present a veritable smorgasbord of activities and entertainments.

While there will be an emphasis on things aeronautical (after all, it is an airport), the day's events are designed to appeal to the broadest spectrum of attendees as possible. Here are just some of the things you will encounter. Over 100 custom motorcycles, racing cars from Ukiah Speedway, Roller Derby and skating races, radio controlled model aircraft, skateboard exhibitions, strolling musicians, food and informational booths, experimental and unusual aircraft flown in from all over the State, who will participate in flying skill competitions such as spot landings, flour bombing, and much more. There is a 9 AM pancake breakfast served up by the National Guard from a large modern food service vehicle planned along with a display and tours of their latest

military hardware. California Division of Forestry flying and static demonstrations. A flyover by a Stealth Bomber has been requested through official channels.

Bounce houses, face painting and many other children's activities, along with cotton candy and free popcorn. Performances by Native American dance groups, food and refreshment vendors and so much more!
