Membership – We increased our membership by one last month with the addition of David Hauke who flew in from the East to inspect and purchase Marty Spragg's Piper PA16 (Clipper). At the time I met David he was getting checked out and hoped to master all the handling intricacies of this aircraft before taking it home.

Treasurer – Our current bank balance is \$7089.43 with not much activity. We had two deposits totaling \$730 of which \$670 was for donations to the Air Academy Fund. The Most recent Air Academy donation resulted from a ticket auction held by Walt Lewis at our last meeting for a David Clark headset that Ed Steiger had donated. We had one check disbursement of \$250 for legal advise (a bargain) to an attorney who is working to assist in filing our incorporation papers.

There's been some confusion in regard to reimbursement or lack thereof in regard to the monthly dinners. Some newer members were under the impression that not only did they set up the dinner but that they also had to pay for it! As has been the policy in the past, expenses are reimbursed at the time of the dinner either in cash (if receipts are enough) or by check. MOVIE NIGHT AT SKYPARK

The next movie at Sonoma Skypark will be Friday evening, May 27 at 6 p.m. and will feature "The Rocketeer", starring Ted Babini's (now Walt Bowe's) Ryan STA, as well as a bunch of other great old airplanes.

The Rocketeer was a graphic novel, which is to say an adult-oriented comic book. Set in the Golden Age of Aviation during the 1930s, it features a young pilot as the hero who flies a rocket-powered backpack, then uses the invention to battle the bad guys. There are some great scenes of classic air racing using actual aircraft of the period, including the Ryan STA, a GeeBee racer and others. Campy, colorful with some great flying scenes. What more could you ask.

The Rocketeer is a [superhero](#) created by writer/illustrator [Dave Stevens](#). The character first appeared in 1982 and is a homage to the Saturday matinee heroes of the 1930s and 1940s.

The Rocketeer is Cliff Secord, a stunt pilot who discovers a mysterious [jet pack](#) that

allows him to fly. His adventures are set in 1938 [Los Angeles](#), and Stevens gave them a retro, nostalgic feel influenced by the [King of the Rocket Men](#) movie serial, the syndicated [Commando Cody](#) TV series (both from [Republic Pictures](#)), and pinup diva [Bettie Page](#).

In 1991, [The Rocketeer](#) was released as a feature film by [Walt Disney Pictures](#) and was directed by [Joe Johnston](#). Rocketeer creator [Dave Stevens](#) has a small cameo in the movie. He is the German test pilot who is killed when the Nazis' version of a [rocket backpack](#) explodes during its take-off sequence. This is a part of the smuggled black-and-white film footage showing the Nazis' top secret rocket backpack tests.

There will be pizza for \$5 per person, and popcorn just to whet your appetite (or spoil it).

Board of Directors Meeting April 12, 2011

Meeting called to order: 6:15 p.m.
PRESENT: Travis Morton, Janet Woods, Bill Wheadon, Walt Lewis, B.K. White, Gardner Bride, Paul Siebert, Darrel Jones, Marsi Fahraji.

President Travis Morton proposed setting up an Internet drop box for officers to use for file sharing and keep shared files current. He will act as administrator as President.

President Morton proposed offering flight school members an EAA Chapter 1268 membership with the first year local chapter dues paid by the flight school to encourage new pilots to join the Chapter. No action was needed by the Board because the flight school is not associated with the Chapter.

Treasurer Bill Wheadon reported that he is able to send financial reports to any member requesting them in addition to the regular monthly reports in the newsletter.

Old Business: Board member Darrel Jones reported that the Chapter 1268 501.c.3 application and bylaws revisions have been sent to Patricia Arthur, the attorney working with EAA Chapters applying for non-profit status for her review. He expects the review and any changes will be completed by the May meeting, at which time the membership can vote to approve the bylaws revisions.

Darrel Jones reported that four Air Academy participants are confirmed to go to Oshkosh this summer, with a fifth possibly going. Airline reservations have been made, but the

Chapter hasn't received work on EAA National scholarships yet. The confirmed participants are Amir Fahraji, Garrett Porter, Emanuel Burke and Troy Hewitt.

NEW BUSINESS: President Morton reported that Saturday, May 21 is National EAA international Learn To Fly Day and requests that Chapter 1268 members invite friends to Sonoma Skypark for a "Older Eagles" flight to introduce them to aviation.

Board meeting adjourned at 6:51 p.m.

General Membership Meeting April 12, 2011

Meeting called to Order 7:39 p.m.

March 8 minutes approved with corrections. Moved by B.K. White / 2d by Jeannette Woods.

Dinner was provided by Ana Diaz and Emmanuel Burke and consisted of pizza, pasta, salad, bread and chocolate cake. Coffee was provided by Gardner Bride of Petaluma Coffee and Tea, with a carrot cake by Robyn Tatman.

Guest & new member: Dave Hauke. Purchased 1949 PA 16, Clipper from Marty and Fran Spragg.

President Travis Morton reported on the Learn To Fly Day and asked for pilots and ground crew on Saturday May 21.

Treasurer Bill Wheadon reported the treasury has \$6,049.00. He announced that any member can request financial information about the Chapter by phone or email.

Young Eagles liaison BK White reported 22 Young Eagles were flown April 10 with eight pilots and airplanes participating. BK thanked the pilots and ground crew for their continuing support. He also told the

members present that the Valley of the Moon Amateur Radio Club is operating a demonstration radio station at Young Eagles.

Air Explorer Post 1268 advisor Walt Lewis announced the donation and auction of a pair of David Clark headsets, with the winner being Barry Danieli. \$120 was raised toward the Air Academy scholarships.

Board member Darrel Jones reported on the Young Eagles and Air Explorers Chapter 1268, Post 1268 and Sonoma Skypark are sponsoring to the Air Academy this summer. He also reported on the review of the bylaws revisions and the IRS 501.c.3 application and told the members that the revised bylaws would be emailed for their review so they could be approved at the May meeting. He then asked that the President entertain a motion to raise the Chapter's contribution by \$100 to \$900 to cover the deposits the Chapter had already sent to EAA. The President accepted a second from the floor and the motion was voted and passed unanimously.

Bill Wheadon announced that the EAA B-17 would be flying from Napa County Airport May 13-15. He also said that Chapter 167 would be flying Young Eagles May 14 and 15.

After the general meeting was adjourned, the speaker for the evening was Les Goldner who talked about electric aircraft and the current and changing technology for batteries and motors. He also spoke about dealing with the FAA in his efforts to get approval for building an electric aircraft.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:10 pm.
