
FIRST THINGS FIRST

Treasurer – According to America West Bank we have a checking account balance of \$4170.31. Three deposits totaling \$797 were made since the last bank statement. EAA Chapter 1268 BOARD MINUTES
February 14, 2012

Officers present: Pres. Travis Morton, VP Jeanette Woods, YE BK White, BOD Walt Lewis, Treas. Bill Wheadon, BOD Darrel Jones and BOD Paul Siebert.

President Travis Morton called the meeting to order at 6:11 p.m.

Travis reported that the weathercam is operational from the flight school office and shows current weather conditions at Sonoma Skypark.

He also reported that Air Academy applications will be due by February 29.

Jeanette Woods reported that there is an insurance rate increase this year.

BK White reported that there were 21 Young Eagles flown by 7 pilots.

Walt Lewis reported that there were six new members of the Air Explorer Post 1268 at Sonoma Skypark. He also reported on the scholarships available from the local 99's Chapter. Walt is discussing helping the 99's with their concession stand with Air Explorer Post members at the August Wings Over Wine Country air show this August. Walt reported that Eric Presten is selling the family glider for possible use of prospective young pilots at Sonoma Skypark. The Post also has had clubhouse clean-up days to organize the adjacent work space hangar.

Paul Siebert raised the issue of Young Eagles pilots running-up their airplanes while facing the public across the ramp deadline being a possible safety issue. It was agreed that there would be a pilot briefing for all Young Eagles pilots at each Young Eagles Day and that pilots would be directed to conduct all operations consistently and safely.

Treasurer Bill Wheadon reported that 24 members have renewed with approximately 40 members still needing to renew.

The Board of Directors meeting was adjourned at 6:48.

GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

President Travis Morton called the meeting to order at 7:40 p.m.

Dinner was furnished by Bill and Jan Wheadon with chili, corn bread and salad, with desserts brought by Robin Tatman and Marsi Fahraji.

FROM PAUL SIEBERT: MOTION INDUCED BLINDNESS

For all you pilots out there... and duck hunters too... and folks who drive cars... and I'm not sure who this would not apply to?

It works exactly like it says, and is one major reason people in cars can look right at you (when you're on a motorcycle or bicycle)

---AND NOT SEE YOU.

From a former Naval Aviator - This is a great illustration of what we were taught about scanning outside the cockpit when I went through training back in the '50s. We were told to scan the horizon for a short

distance, stop momentarily, and repeat the process. I can remember being told why this was the most effective technique to locate other aircraft. It was emphasized (repeatedly) to NOT fix your gaze for more than a couple of seconds on any single object. The instructors, some of whom were WWII veterans with years of experience, instructed us to continually "keep our eyes moving and our head on a swivel" because this was the best way to survive, not only in combat, but from peacetime hazards (like a midair collision) as well. We basically had to take the advice on faith (until we could experience for ourselves) because the technology to demonstrate it didn't exist at that time.
