AIR ACADEMY UPDATE

We've recently learned that the EAA national office will not be offering scholarships for our Air Academy participants this year. Last year our four participants received scholarships covering the balance of their tuition so the Chapter had no trouble funding the balance of the cost, including airfare.

Anticipating similar scholarship levels, the Board of Directors selected four participants again this year and committed to fully funding their Air Academy expenses. After Young Eagles credits and the deposits sent to EAA to reserve six slots, there is a balance of \$2300 for tuition with airfare in addition to that. Tickets have already been purchased for one of the participants at a cost of \$773 plus another \$200 for unaccompanied minor from San Francisco to Appleton, WI. Two of the other

participants won't be charged as unaccompanied minors and one will be traveling one-way only, so the costs will not be as high. The Air Explorers will be paying for the airfare for Troy Hewitt and Daniel Shulte, so we have the air fare for Garrett Porter and Ben Presten to cover, which should be about \$1500 to \$1700.

The Sonoma Skypark hamburger fund will be able to contribute \$2,000, and we have the offer of another donation from one of our members for \$250 for each of the four young people to help pay their tuition.

That leave's us with about \$1,000 to raise to cover the expenses this year. There are funds in the club treasury to help toward that, but we are asking our members for any contributions they can make to help out. It might be possible that some members have frequent flyer miles that could be applied to the cost of the airfare.

All four young people going are enthused about the opportunity and have shown committed interest to flying and a future as aviation professionals. It is unfortunate that EAA national has reduced their scholarship support. The result is that the Chapter will only be able to sponsor two kids to Air Academy in the future, although we will continue to reserve six slots so other local young people can attend by paying their own expenses.

We will discuss this issue at the meeting Tuesday and see what solutions we can find. If you are unable to attend but would like to contribute, please contact me or drop your donation off at the airport office to my attention.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Travis has been flying like crazy instructing here at Sonoma Skypark with his business, Sonoma Valley Flying Club. He teaches in both a 172 and a Citabria and has several students nearing their check ride.

Travis has proposed having his students enroll in EAA national's six month trial membership, and concurrently having them join Chapter 1268 as guest members so they can receive the newsletter, attend meetings and learn more about EAA and our Chapter.

MEMBERSHIP CHAIRMAN AND TREASURER'S REPORT
