Membership Report - This month's membership report will feature my occasional member profile article which this month features one of our somewhat new members, **Ron Willis**. You've probably seen Ron if you've spent any time around the Sonoma Skypark Airport, usually in the company of John Thomason. I decided to feature Ron after speaking to his wife at Jack's wine cave dinner in September when she told me of his single-minded pursuit of a private pilot license. I asked Ron to give me a bio to aid in my writing this article. Below is his submission which I was able to reproduce with only minor editorial changes:

Ron Willis (the other Ron)

I was born in Newport, Oregon and was raised in Lincoln City, Oregon. After High School I went to California to work in the TV and stereo business where I repaired them at home and in the shop.

I received a college education in electronics and was drafted in 1966 by Uncle Sam for the Army (100,000 people were drafted every month). I was transferred to Germany and ended up in Belgium (just lucky as most were going to Vietnam). I was one of ten Army personnel with a secret clearance that monitored messages on a microwave system. Yes, there were nuclear weapons on the base. After the Army and some more college I went back to California to work in the TV repair business but the company folded after 15 years. I then went to work for a cable company and ended up a Supervisor for 25 years - after 31 years I retired in 2014.



One of the people I worked with was Calvin Wojciechowski and he introduced me to Skypark and John Thomason (and so many

more). I helped rebuild the 1954 Super Cub that John now owns. I received encouragement from many to get my private license. Thanks to John and others I am now soloing and ready to finish up. I can't forget to thank Richard Craig who is my CFI. The most discouraging thing is that pilots say that I will only use about 20% of the information that I've been learning. Editor's note- *Ron--you'll be continuing to learn more new information and skills as your flying endeavors proceed.* I have now been to Oshkosh 3 times and all I can say is that it is an experience everyone should enjoy.

At SkyPark, I have never met a friendlier bunch of people. They go out of the way to help and are always friendly. There are so many great stories, and knowledge that they share. The EAA for Young Eagles is amazing and the pilots who donate time and their aircraft are great. This has increased my interest in aviation. I could not have wished for a better place to spend some of my retirement years. Thank you all - Ron

LONG TIME SKYPARK GUY GONE

John (Jack) Francis Strehl, 77, passed from this earth on 9/17/16 surrounded by his brother, Brian, and his longtime caregiver, Yara Tikoilakeba, at his home in Sonoma after a long illness under the care of Hospice by the Bay.

Mr. Strehl was born on August 3, 1939, in Paterson, NJ. He graduated from Bergen Tech. He served in the U.S. Army with the 10th Cavalry Regiment of the 4th I.D. out of Ft. Carson, CO.

Jack spent the majority of his working life in electronic components with major OEMs,

Texas Instruments and National Semiconductor, before starting his own distribution company, Spectrum Electronics, in Northern California. He moved to Sonoma in 1998. He was instrumental in establishing the present-day Sonoma Skypark Airport. Jack had a lifelong love of planes, go-cart racing, hang gliding, and snow skiing. He owned quite a collection of planes over the years. He could often be found flying them out of Sonoma Skypark, in addition to North and South America. He enjoyed attending air shows and sponsoring and racing his T-28B at the Reno Air Races. Among his other passions later in life was flying remote-control planes at Sonoma Skypark. For about 10 years he enjoyed annual trips to Mexico with men who shared a passion for fishing. He also had a love of dogs and had four whom he loved.

He was preceded in death by his father, Francis Phillip Strehl; his mother, Mary Flynn Strehl; his ex-wife, Arlene (Daniels) Strehl; and a 9-year-old sister, Kathleen Strehl.

Survivors include his brother, Brian (Sisene) of San Andreas; two nieces – Alisha Burnes (NYC) and Alanya Anderson (San Andreas); and four nephews – Ethan Anderson (SF), Ian Anderson (SF), Devin Strehl (San Andreas), and Shae Strehl (South Lake Tahoe).
