The Board meeting was called to order by President Robin Tatman at 6:00 pm. Present were Bill Wheadon, Treasurer, Don Booker, Vice President, BK White, Young Eagles liaison, Paul Siebert and Darrel Jones, Board members. Guests were Marc Ashton and Jan Wheadon.

Darrel bought new cabinets for the Chapters videos and books, with room for the Air Explorer library. The cost was \$326.00.

The Chapter received letters from the Sonoma Mentoring Alliance, EAA Air Academy and the Air Academy participants from last summer. They will be scanned and included with the next newsletter.
